# WHO WE ARE

Americans for Immigrant Justice (AI Justice) opened its doors in January 1996 in anticipation of anti-immigrant laws that included preventing federally funded Legal Services Organizations from assisting most immigrants unless they already had legal status. Since then, AI Justice has served over 130,000 immigrants from all over the world.

Our multicultural and multilingual staff work to create change both for individual clients and systematically, using a unique combination of free direct legal services, policy reform, impact litigation, and public education at local, state, and national levels. With no right to free appointed counsel in immigration proceedings, more immigrants than ever are in need of competent and zealous representation.

In Florida and on a national level, AI Justice champions the rights of unaccompanied immigrant children; advocates for survivors of trafficking and domestic violence; serves as a watchdog on immigration detention practices and policies; and speaks for immigrant groups who have particular and compelling claims to justice.

Our vision is to bring about an American society where immigrants are not subjected to abuse or injustice; are not afraid to seek help; have a fair opportunity to make their case in the system that governs them; and have their contributions valued and encouraged.




